The Pastor's Pen

A Resilient Community in Uncertain Times

Did anyone think in March of 2020 when we closed the church doors that we would still be facing so much uncertainty here in September of 2021? Back then we were hoping for a few weeks of disruption and that life would go on as before. Now we are wise enough to say we just don't know what will happen next. We have all learned to be more flexible, more resilient.

How do we keep the church community together and strong in such a time as this? We have done many things over the past 18 months that have kept us together. The mission of the church has continued. We have provided worship on-line, outdoors, and most recently in the sanctuary. We have taken communion together and made each home a sanctuary. Pastoral care visits and phone calls have continued. Don't hesitate to contact me if you have or know of a pastoral care need. We have contributed money, time, and people toward helping our neighbors. We have worked with VOICE and other organizations that are working on issues like housing (including eviction policy during the pandemic), mental health resources, and vaccination. Small groups, study groups, and musical groups have met via zoom or in back yards. We were able to hold VBS for the children of our church. Youth group has met via zoom and in person including a fall one day retreat and took two groups for mission work this summer. We welcomed new confirmands. We have had fellowship events, including outdoor concerts and gatherings in member's homes.

As we move into the fall of 2021, there are unknowns. Will we be able to have the church retreat? We are waiting until mid-late September to decide, after we see what happens with community transmission when school starts. So we will keep you posted. Will we be able to continue worshiping in the building? We are keeping an eye on things, but now that we are filming the service on Sundays, we will likely be able to have at least a limited number of people attend the service in person. What we do know is that we will continue to offer outside worship as long as the weather allows since it is the safest option, especially for those who remain unvaccinated.

We are planning a fun rally day celebration on September 12, and praying the weather cooperates for the outdoor events we have scheduled. We begin with worship at 10:00 a.m. for everyone outside. We will be using the lower parking lot, so ask that you park on the street. Following worship, Soulfire will play a concert in the same location. You are invited to bring lunch or snacks and stay for outdoor fellowship and music.

On October 3, I will be on the front lawn of the church for blessing of the pets from 2:30 - 5:00 p.m. This is always a fun event and has the benefit of being an especially safe activity during the pandemic. The protocol is that individuals or families bring their pet(s), tell a little it about them, and then a prayer/blessing is offered. As they leave, the next pet is welcomed for the blessing.

We are open to new ideas about how we can meet the needs of the community during the coming months. Do you have a great idea for fellowship or learning? An event you would like to see? Help us think of safe ways to provide the nurture and education our children need from the community of faith. We are all having to be flexible and careful but we also need to be church for and with one another. Let's continue to get through this as a resilient, caring, and vital community of faith.


Plans change and these days we are more aware of that than ever and we've had become a little more flexible.

Vacation Bible School 2021

After a year with no Sunday school for children, the CE ministry felt it was important to try and have some form of VBS. We knew that it could not look like the previous years. For a start, we couldn't have 100+ children running around the building.

So what could we do?

The decision was made early on to try and have a smaller VBS, it would just be for people who considered Trinity their home. It would mean stripping away a lot of what we take for granted each year and creating something simple and fun.

The truth is, you can plan something to within an edge of perfection but if you don't have people then it is all for naught. People do something magical; they bring life. Our VBS couldn't have happened without the parents, grandparents, and youth being willing to bring it to life.



I've enjoyed the other VBS we've done in the past but I've also found it a little overwhelming. 100+ kids are great energy but I only know a handful of them and I don't see them again until the next year when their parents need a summer camp.

But this year, felt manageable. People weren't stressed. There weren't a million decibels of noise and adults weren't frantically counting to see if they had the right amount of tiny people in their group. There wasn't

the logistical nightmare of putting the right number of kids in each class and having all the right paperwork. Rotations were easy to work out because there were only four classes. Everyone got a turn because there was enough time and enough space and enough resources.

But probably the biggest joy for me was being able to see our kids with their Trinity family. Getting to know the adults, getting to know each other, there was no doubt that they would see each other again. And that's how relationships grow, that's how a church grows.

So honestly, I wasn't sad that we couldn't have the 100+ kids. I was overjoyed that we could have a VBS that brought our children together to give them happy memories of their church family, to help them grow those relationships that will keep them at the church and help them want to find a church when they get older.

So thank you to everyone who helped; during the week, behind the scenes, and with your prayers because in spite of all the mess going on in the world, VBS this year was a beautiful, simple, success.

Session Highlights

Session Highlights for August 2021

Following are highlights of the session's regular monthly meeting, held remotely on August 10. For more information, touch base with Pastor Judith, Clerk Jim Dykstra or any session member:

- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt said new chairs are still needed for the Pastoral Care and Worship and Music Ministries.
- A focus of the meeting was on Trinity's response to the surge in COVID Delta Variant cases. Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt asked Session members for questions and concerns for consideration by the Trinity Reopening Team when it meets soon. Discussed was a possible plan for two Sunday morning services, one in the sanctuary and the other on the Trinity front lawn. There was also discussion of how best to handle Christian education classes for adults, youth and children.
- Rev. Judith Fulp-Eickstaedt said that in-person session meetings, which were expected to resume effective the September 14 regular session meeting, will be postponed because of the Delta variant. The last inperson Session meeting was on March 10, 2020, with Session meeting virtually via Zoom since then because of the pandemic. Zoom meetings will continue until the situation is clearer.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt led a discussion of the fall Session retreat, which was to have been held in the Knox Room on the weekend of September 17-18, with meetings on Friday evening and Saturday. The retreat will now be held in the Trinity parking lot on a Saturday, either September 11 or 18.
- The Fellowship Ministry reported successful events were held at the homes of Randy and Cathy Benn and Matt and Michelle Edwards. In addition, a successful Trinity Men's Group annual brat fry event was held at the home of Jim Dykstra.
- The Facilities Management Ministry reported that Ministry Chair Skip Stephens will step down at completion of his two-year term on September 1, 2021. A tree in the parking lot was blown down in a storm and removed; the new narthex roof did not leak during recent severe storms; there was some water accumulation beneath Judith's office; the church's two steeples will be painted; painting in the pre-school area has been completed; and the new audio/visual system is successful and is being used for recording services

Finances Explained

June 30 marked the end of Trinity's current fiscal year. The impacts of Covid-19 were reflected in reduced contributions from our congregation as well as a reduction in our building use income. These reductions were offset by the forgiveness of the Payroll Protection Program loan of approximately \$90,000 as well as reduced expenses for many of our ministries.

We are so grateful for the many people who were able to continue to support Trinity with their financial contributions as well as all of you who supported us with your time, talents and prayers during the pandemic.
