The Pastor's Pen

A Summer of Old Fashioned Worship

Dear Trinity Friends,

I am so excited to be back to in-person worship starting on May 2 with services on the lawn. It has been a long winter with limited in-person contact and I have been so grateful for the opportunities I have had to see you in small group gatherings, as the choir has met to safely provide music for services, and in one-on-one pastoral conversations. I am hopeful for the success of vaccinations and that we can safely gather in the church building as we move into the Fall.

The COVID re-opening team at Trinity has projected outdoor services for May, June, and July, as we begin to think about transitioning back inside (depending, of, course, on continued progress in bringing case numbers down and vaccination rates up). We plan to put up the worship tents we use for picnic Sunday to provide some shade on the front part of the lawn and are grateful for the shade our trees will provide to other parts of the lawn. We will continue to require sign-ups for worship in the case that we would need to do contact tracing. We will ask you to bring your own chairs and on communion Sundays to bring your own communion elements. If you can not make it in person or don't feel comfortable in person, we will continue to offer the recorded worship video.

As I have been thinking about summer worship outside this year, I am reminded of old family pictures I have seen, back when families came to worship by horse and buggy. In the summer in those days it was unbearable inside because no air conditioning, so gatherings were often held outdoors. Because you could never tell how long the preaching would go on in those days, people would pack a picnic lunch and bring it along with them so they could eat when worship was over and before heading back home. We are encouraging you to do the same thing this summer! I don't plan on preaching any of those full hour or two hour sermons people preached back in the day, but we are thinking a Sunday worship gathering is a great chance for some outside fellowship as long as people maintain proper distancing. Bring a picnic lunch and stay after worship to chat with friends, gather with your small group, or meet someone new you may not have talked with before. We will not have a formal "picnic Sunday" where Trinity is providing food, but any Sunday of summer worship can become a picnic Sunday and a chance to strengthen our connections as a community of faith.

And speaking of picnic Sunday, that is the time when we usually receive confirmands and honor our graduates. We will do those things on the second Sunday of June, so let us know if you have a graduate or are a graduate (high school, college, degree program) and if you will be able to attend outdoor worship that day.

Summer outdoor worship is also a great time for baptisms. If you have been thinking of having your child baptized and waiting until post-pandemic worship, we would be excited to celebrate a baptism at one of the summer services. Let me know and I will be happy to work with you on scheduling a date that works for you and your family.

We have lots to be grateful for as we maneuver our way through what are hopefully the last few months of worship outside our building. As we move closer to the Fall, we will let you know what protocols we will have in place and our projected schedule for resuming indoor worship. Thank you for your patience as we work through the details. And enjoy a summer of old-fashioned worship!!!

In good news, Trinity's Session passed a motion on Tuesday, April 20, that will make the Racial Justice Group a full Ministry Team. At the next congregational meeting, the congregation will be asked to vote on a change to our bi-laws to approve this change. Previously the Racial Justice Group was under the Christian Education and Nurture ministry.

In more good news, helped by the recent letter-writing campaign, The Arlington County Board in late April took several key actions that VOICE had strongly supported regarding affordable and sustainable housing. Board Vice Chair Katie Cristol said: "We appreciate so much your thoughtful engagement throughout the budget process, and your counsel to us and recommendations, which are always rooted in the faith that we can do better by our residents with lower incomes and our shared values of inclusiveness." What is VOICE?



Since August 2020, Trinity has been taking part in VOICE (Virginians Organized for Interfaith Community Engagement) a multiracial, interfaith coalition of almost 50 faith communities and civic organizations in Northern Virginia working together to build power in middle- and low-income communities to make change. Through VOICE, Trinity members are taking action on issues impacting our community, from affordable housing to health care. Our discerning year with VOICE will come to a close soon and we will have to vote if we want to become a full member. Please use this time to get involved and try out some of the opportunities presented by VOICE. - Install
- Type in "Trinity Presbyterian Arlington" for your church.
- Click Default for the Icon Enjoy.

There are a few kinks we are working out (especially for android users, who might experience an error when first downloading it. The app will still work.). 

Session Highlights

Session Highlights for April 2021

Following are highlights of the session's regular monthly meeting, held remotely on April 19. For more information, touch base with Pastor Judith, Clerk Jim Dykstra or any session member:

- Session approved Paul Mannes as guest preacher at worship on Sunday, May 9.
- Session received the quarterly review of Trinity's finances. As a result of COVID, regular offerings and building use revenues are down, creating a significant shortfall in the church's finances. Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt noted that most churches are experiencing the same challenges, and Trinity's financial health is better than many of its counterparts.
- The Worship and Music Ministry reported that work on the sanctuary audio-visual system is done. Formal training to operate the system was held for a small group of volunteers, with a second training session planned.
- Session approved a motion from the Facilities Management Ministry for an Eagle Scout project in the out-door upper chapel.
- Session approved a motion from the Racial Justice Group that it become a full ministry, with a chair, elder liaison and budget. Revision of Trinity bylaws and approval by the congregation will be required.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt reported that she had provided training for three incoming elders on Sunday, April 18, with training of the other two planned for Saturday, April 24. Ordination and installation is planned for Sunday, May 9, with Sunday, May 16 the rain date.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt led a brief discussion on ministry chair terms. New chairs are still needed for the Pastoral Care Ministry and the Worship and Music Ministry. Priscilla Hoffman-Stowe was approved as new chair of the Fellowship Ministry.
- Elder Commissioner Troy Schneider provided a report on the Presbytery meeting held on March 23.
- Rev/ Fulp-Eickstaedt led discussion on plans for a spring session retreat, including both outgoing and incoming elders, to be held on Saturday, May 15, in the church parking lot, as was done with the fall retreat.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt led discussion on plans for outdoor services as weather improves, with the return to outdoor worship services on the Trinity lawn in May and June. The Reopening Team met on April 20, and its motion to permit worship and other activities for up to 50 indoors and 100 outdoors, with masks and social distancing, consistent with guidelines for the State of Virginia announced by Gov. Ralph Northam, was approved. Further, food would be allowed to be consumed on Trinity property in these scenarios, as long as people remain masked when not eating and maintain physical distance at all times.
- An update was provided on Vacation Bible School planning, which is under way.




Trinity in bloom


