
Welcome to New Contemporary Worship Leader, Alan MacEwen

Dear God,

I don't have a lot of words these days. Depression does that. Anxiety does that. They steal your words. They hide your logic. They siphon your energy. I can't remember which direction the sun is supposed to rise. It feels like it's always raining. So here I am. soaked to the bone. bringing you the words I have left because you are the one who calmed the storm. You are the one who walked on water, so please, God, walk my way. Come find me. Remind me that I am not alone. Calm the waters. Stop the wind.



Bring the sun back. Throw me a life jacket. Give me strength. Send a lifeboat. Turn on the searchlights. Teach me how to swim. Walk my way. That would be enough. How can we meaningfully address racism?

You are invited to join the Racial Justice Ministry in discerning how Trinity can heed the call from the PCU-SA. PCUSA has issued its **Final Report: Special Committee on Racism Truth and Reconciliation**. **What is this?** The work of the committee, which includes 14 members and two staff resource persons, goes back to the creation of a special commission by the 222nd General Assembly (2016) and subsequent reconstitution of the commission as a special committee by the 223rd General Assembly (2018). The final report urges Presbyterians to build on the denomination's past efforts to meaningfully address racism. To do that, reparative action by national church agencies, mid councils and congregations is required. "There can be no reconciliation without reparations," the report's "Call to Worship" section states. "Truth + reparations = reconcilia-

tion."

The report also includes recommendations for helping Presbyterians research the shaping role of white supremacy in their local communities. "There is no passive-reading of this report," the report explains. "You, also, are called as partners in a moral, ethical and divine mandate to end racism in our denomination." The report can be read at the <u>Special Committee's web page</u> on pcusa.org.

Lemonade on the Lawn is our social hour after our single worship in the summertime. Small groups, families, and ministries can sign up to host a week. What d you need to do?



Ivy Brigade Recap

We did the job! From our very scientific inspection, I would say we eliminated ivy growing on 90 percent of the trees in the Trinity woods. That's pretty darn good for a three-hour work period with a dirty dozen, rag-tag army, composed of geriatric champions! We had one adult under the age of 50 (Natalie Foley and her two children), and three adults in their 50's, and the rest of us were 65 years and older! Jack the Lane may have had lots of muscle, but we have stamina and ivy-gripping strength!

Thank you to all who helepd for your hard work and for providing some solid maintenance on our trees. The work we did two years ago really paid off and now we can keep the ivy from taking grip on our trees with work sessions such as these once or twice a year.

Another cool thing that happened yesterday, after nearly everyone left and our group was Natalie and her kids, Savannah and Luke, and Dan Campbell, was that we spotted a migratory bird called a Hooded Warbler (Setophaga Citirina) resting in the woods of Trinity (the photo below is from a website "allaboutbirds.org). This is a rare sighting as this bird is traveling thousands of miles from Central America or Mexico, where it overwintered, and is heading to the boreal forests of the North, where it mates and rears a family. This migration is truly incredible as the birds must sustain a flight pattern that often involves not stopping for hundreds and hundreds of miles and includes flying nonstop over the Gulf of Mexico. The fact that it was found in the Trinity woods is a small miracle in itself. It is resting and finding food until it completes its journey Northbound. What a wonderful thing to behold and more reason to save this little tiny patch of forest.

Session Highlights and Financials

Session Highlights for April 2022

Following are highlights of the session's regular monthly meeting, held remotely on April 6. For more information, touch base with Pastor Judith, Clerk Jim Dykstra or any session member:

- Bill Plitt was added to the rolls as an associate member at his request.
- Elder Cindy Bare provided a brief update on the Membership Inventory Project.
- Session heard a proposal from the Education and Nurture Ministry regarding the composition of the Trinity Preschool Board and approved a one-year exception to the preschool by-laws as proposed, with the understanding that the underlying trends leading to this issue will be studied in the next year with an appropriate long-term solution proposed at that time.
- Session deferred for action until the May meeting a Worship and Music Ministry proposal, in conjunction with the Administration Ministry, regarding staff support for the new A/V system.
- Session approved a Worship and Music Ministry proposal, as amended, regarding a formal Trinity A/V recording and/or photography policy which will be added to the church's administrative manual.
- Session authorized Rev. Judith Fulp-Eickstaedt to administer the sacrament of baptism to Emerson Bailey Trout, son of Kate Bailey and Aaron Trout, and to Katheryn Rose McCormick, daughter of Jonathan and Carolyn Klein McCormick.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt said that training of incoming elders will take place on Saturday, April 9, with ordination and installation planned for Sunday, May 22.
- Clerk Jim Dykstra confirmed that Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt's terms of call, approved at the annual meeting, have been sent by the Administration ministry to Presbytery.
- David Bailor, elder commissioner to the March 22 Presbytery meeting, provided a report on the meeting.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt said a new chair is still needed for the Pastoral Care Ministry. In addition, it was announced that Kemper Gay is stepping down immediately as chair of the Education and Nurture Ministry, and Finance Ministry Chair Rich Bailey will be stepping down this summer at the end of his term.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt reported that staff reviews will take place in May and June.
- A spring retreat will be held on Saturday, May 14, in the Knox Room for current and incoming session members.
- An offer is being extended to a candidate to be the new contemporary worship team leader.
- The Racial Justice Ministry is preparing a Diversity in Worship concert on May 1.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt said there will be Stations of the Cross collages on display in the Narthex during Holy Week.
