## **Angel Stars Begins Through December 9th**

Trinity is sponsoring our annual Angel Stars program, and continuing our partnership with Children



of Mine (COM). COM is a drop-in center that provides mentorship, nutritional support, tutoring, guidance and other services to neighborhood kids from across Anacostia. <u>https://childrenofminedc.org/</u>

COM's kids' come from families of very limited means. Many will go without Christmas gifts, including new winter clothes, without support from Trinity's congregation and preschool families.

Our goal is to provide each of the 61 Children of Mine kids at least a \$75 gift card. In the past two years, we have raised enough to increase the cards to \$100 and provide Safeways cards for their families for their holiday meals. Since the kids are out of school over the holiday and not receiving their free breakfast and lunch meals from the DC schools, this has been a great help.

#### **Bakers Wanted for Advent Worship (and Eaters Needed)**





# **Enjoy Christmas Music this December at Trinity**

Each Sunday we will have a selection of Christmas music beginning at 11am in the sanctuary. If you are eager to hear hand bells, they will be featured in service in the traditional service on December 4th. The choir will lift their voices on December 11th in the traditional service as well. We will be caroling on December 18th at 5pm and also after the Christmas morning worship service at 10am. We have other special music plans in the works and will be sure to keep you updated in the bulletin and enews.

### **Earth Care Tips for the Holidays**

The Earth Care team had an enthusiastic 2022 kick off meeting with a wide range of ideas for the coming year. A few of the ideas that came up were timely for the holidays.

- 1) **Reduce**: Bring your own coffee cup to worship (and to the Wednesday Evening Advent cocoa and cookies!) This saves using disposable cups.
- 2) **Gift Wrap**: Wrap your presents with earth friendly elements. You can google "eco-friendly" wrapping for ever growing options of wrapping paper and string. Of course, using up your



current wrapping paper is a good start. Before buying new wrapping, consider buying recycled paper, avoid buying paper with foil on it (metallic/foil can not be recycled) and instead of tissue paper for the inside of the gift bags, cut up some paper into strips. Alternatives to consider purchasing foil gift wrap and plastic ribbon: paper curling ribbon, cotton string for ribbon, recycled wrapping paper, or a plain brown paper roll and decorate it with stamps or have fun coloring or printing their name on the paper. 3) **Recycle**: Did you know? These items can NOT be recycled: gift wrapping with foil in it, tissue paper, and plastic curling ribbons/bows. Keep them out of the recycle bins so the whole recycle load is not contaminated and put those items in the trash bins or re-use them.

### **Session Highlights for November 2022**

Following are highlights of the session's regular monthly meeting, held via Zoom on Tuesday, November 8. For more information, touch base with Pastor Judith, Clerk Jim Dykstra or any session member:

- Session welcomed Katherine Hanckel as a new member.
- Session was given an update on the membership inventory project.
- Session discussed Trinity's Discernment Initiative. Rev. Judith Fulp-Eickstaedt said the ministries are moving forward to address the findings of the discernment process.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt gave an update on Stewardship Sunday, which will take place on Sunday, Nov. 13.
- The staffing review task force gave an update on its work. It will be consulting with church staff and ministry chairs for their perspective. The goal is to have the review completed by May 2023.
- The Youth Director search committee has identified a lead candidate to fill the position.
- Rev. Bill Davnie was approved as guest pastor on Sunday, Nov. 20.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt gave an update on plans for her sabbatical in the summer of 2023 and said she is working with Rev. Bill Davnie to serve as interim pastor while she is gone.
- Session was given a report on the fall Trinity retreat at Massanetta Springs, which was a big success, with over 70 attendees.
- Session approved a Worship and Music Ministry motion regarding live streaming of worship services.
- Session approved a Mission and Service Ministry motion to include the charity Resilient Threads in the Alternative Gifts Mart fundraiser on December 4.
- Jennifer McGrail was approved as an Elder Commissioner to the November 15 Presbytery meeting.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt said she hopes to fill openings for ministry chairs soon.
- Clerk Jim Dykstra said he had filed the Annual Necrology Report with Presbytery, reporting that elders Bill Stephens and Jack Wilson had died in the past year.
- The annual review of Trinity's active rolls is ongoing.
- Clerk Jim Dykstra will participate at Lewinsville Presbyterian Church in McLean on Saturday, November 12, in the annual Presbytery clerk records review.
- Rev. Fulp-Eickstaedt said the Covid Management Team had approved having congregation members come forward to receive bread during Communion, with use of the small cups of juice continuing for now.
