



<u>EARTH CARE CLASS: LEWIS ROOM</u>



Trinity's Earth Care team is excited to lead a class based on their activities in the past year and the coming year. Take advantage of the breadth of experience at Trinity to make a difference in your backyard all the way to Trinity's footprint. Welcome!

At Trinity Presbyterian Church we want you to feel comfortable dropping your child off in the nursery or Godly Play rooms knowing that your child is safe, happy, and loved. Ms. Nene is our Childcare Supervisor and is also the Godly Play preschool lead teacher.

We normally keep the infants/babies in Room 1. On the busier Sundays we will have Room 4 (across the hall from Room 1) open for the toddlers so that there is plenty of space. The toddler program is lead by Ms. Lisa. She is trained in Godly Play and will offer a modified version of the Godly Play program with a story, music, snack, and play time. The routine will be the same each week so your child will learn what to expect.

The Godly Play program does not follow the lectionary, so be sure to ask your child what story they learned about today!



New to Trinity?

We welcome you to Trinity. We hope you take the time to try out one of our Adult Education classes held at 10:10 between the services. We have so many ways to get involved at Trinity from worship, music, mis-sion, outreach, and fellowship! If you are interested in joining Trinity, there is a special class called the "Inquirer's Class" which is 4 weeks long and intro-duces you to the church and all of the opportunities here. If you wish, at the end of the session, you are welcome to join our Church.

ing, and baby sitting for other families as well. Pramila is also from India.



Vijaya Dusher (Vee-zhi-ya) has been at Trinity for over 20 years as well and is from the same town in India as Pramila. She is a currently a nanny for a 4 and 6 year old. She loves cooking as well.

What to know when you drop off

your child:

You can drop off your child before service or during the service after an-nouncements.

Please sign in your name (print legibly), where you will be, your child's name and age, and any allergies.

We encourage you to leave a diaper bag (with your child's name clearly marked on it) with wipes, diapers, and a favorite toy and snack. Please let us know when they might like the snack/bottle. Please NO peanut products.

If your child is going to Godly Play, they can be signed in at the back of the sanctuary or Calvin Hall and the care-givers will escort them down to Room 11 (near the playground entrance. You can pick them up in Room 11 after worship.

When your child is signed in, we will put a name tag on their backs and their bag.

If your child is taken for a diaper change in the restroom or to another room, they will be signed out by the caregiver.

Child care is available for infants through Kindergarteners during worship services and the Education Hour.

Infants and Babies: Room 1

For infants - age 15 months. **Toddlers: Room 3**

(16 mos-3 years)

We have room for your toddler to toddle and explore as well as space for infants to be cared for. On our

busier days, the toddlers may be in Room 4. (across the hall).

Preschool-Kindergarteners: (Age 3 - K)

For ages 3 through 6. The Godly Play program is designed to offer the children experiential opportunities and teach them the elements of worship. The children are welcome to go to church until after Children's Moment and then be dismissed for Godly Play.

Ages 6-8

New! During worship we will offer a special Godly Play room for ages 6-8 with crafts and games. We invite parents to sign their child in the same as the younger children.





What is Godly Play?

Godly Play is a Montessori style class for children ages 3 up to Kindergarten. Godly Play is a unique approach to Christian education which invites children to explore and interact with Bible stories while igniting curiosity and wonder about God and their faith. The children have dedicated items to play and discover more about the Bible as well as a variety of crafts to choose from. Each session ends with a blessing and prayer time. Lisa and Nene are both trained in Godly Play.
