Massannetta is upgrading its facilities so that groups like ours have nicer accommodation when we have more than will fit in the lodge. It also has a much broader ministry than accommodating church groups. Since 2016 they have been providing temporary housing for

refugees who are relocating to the Shenandoah Valley. Their most recent work in this area is in partnership with Church World Service. 2025 Stewardship Campaign Results

We have exciting results to share from our 2025 Stewardship Campaign. As you may recall our goal was to increase contributions to the Operating Fund by 11% over the next two years. As of mid-January, the pledges to the Operating Fund for 2025 have already increased by 10%. There are still a few families who intend to pledge for 2025, but have not yet done so, thus we expect this number to increase even more. This increase in pledges comes from a broad group of contributors. Over 75 families increased their pledge over last year.

These pledges will allow Trinity to prepare its budget for the upcoming fiscal year knowing that it has the financial support of the Congregation to achieve the goals set out by the Session.


