

#### ASPIRE AFTERSCHOOL LEARNING

Aspire Afterschool Learning is a nonprofit in South Afrington that helps 150 historically underserved students in 3rd - 8th gradet through no-cost afterschool and summer learning programs that support and connect families, schools, and communities. Students receive academic and homework support, a daily hot med, and time to participate in hands-on projects.



"How much money do you need for Aspire? Because I saved \$50 and you can have it."

The day our students learned that Aspire lost our AmeriCorps funding, many of them wanted to know what they could do to help. One of them drew this \$100 bill and gave it to her teacher. Another offered his own hard-earned savings.

If we don't close the funding gap, one in three students will lose access to this vital program. Will you join our community in sustaining Aspire's work for students?

Aspire is a nonprofit organization that provides no-cost after-school academic and homework support, hands-on projects, and a hot meal to 150 underserved Arlington Students and their families.

Their services are being cut due to the elimination of AmeriCorps positions.

# June 8th Picnic!



Thank you for helping keep his spirits up by sending him cards and letters.


# <u>Trinity is Hiring</u>
