"Uncertainty and chaos have become constant companions. Executive Orders are announced; a reaction takes hold, and then the policy is amended or even withdrawn. Sometimes, certain parts of an Order are challenged in court, resulting in further uncertainty. With each wave, some ask, 'Will this be the end of the chaos?' As more people feel uncertain and anxious with a loss of control, many move from shock to anger, to disillusionment, to a sense of futility. All of which impacts financial and personal security.
