"Uncertainty and chaos have become constant companions. Executive Orders are announced; a reaction takes hold, and then the policy is amended or even withdrawn. Sometimes, certain parts of an Order are challenged in court, resulting in further uncertainty. With each wave, some ask, 'Will this be the end of the chaos?' As more people feel uncertain and anxious with a loss of control, many move from shock to anger, to disillusionment, to a sense of futility. All of which impacts financial and personal security. Yet, coping with these impacts requires dealing with the emotional storm."


Youth and Children's Corner

This year at Massanetta Springs, the James Atwood (our late Pastor Emeritus) Institute for Congregational Courage's annual ecumenical event will welcome clergy and lay leaders to gain new skills, courage, and community for the ministry of gun violence prevention with their congregations.

This year's theme is "Gun Violence Prevention for Such a Time as This." The Institute's keynote speaker, the Rev. Sharon Risher, marks 10 years since her mother and other relatives were killed at the <u>Mother Emmanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church shooting</u> in Charleston, South Carolina.
