## Deuteronomy 26:1-11

“When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess and you possess it and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. 
## **RJM has purchased a new book for the Trinity Library:**

[The New Testament in Color; a Multiethnic Bible Commentary](#) by Esau McCaulley and Others.

*Christianity Today Book Award—Biblical Studies and Foreword INDIES Book of the Year Award Honorable Mention*

Historically, Bible commentaries have focused on the particular concerns of a limited segment of the church, all too often missing fresh questions and perspectives that are fruitful for biblical interpretation. Listening to scholars from diverse backgrounds and ethnicities offers us an opportunity to explore the Bible from a wider angle, a better vantage point.

*The New Testament in Color* is a one-volume commentary on the New Testament written by a multiethnic team of scholars holding orthodox Christian beliefs. Each scholar brings exegetical expertise coupled with a unique interpretive lens to illuminate the ways social location and biblical interpretation work together. Theologically orthodox *and* multiethnically contextual, *The New Testament in Color* fills a gap in biblical understanding for both the academy and the church. Who we are and where God placed us—it's all useful for better understanding his Word. - IVP Press



### **Sunday, November 9th: Zoom with Daoud Nassar from the West Bank in the Lewis Room**

During next Sunday’s 10:10 Sunday School Hour, we will have the opportunity to have a Zoom connection with affiliate member Daoud Nassar, who lives in the West Bank and is the founder of the Tent of Nations, an organization that promotes peaceful solutions to conflict and hosts visitors from all over the world. Visitors come for peace-making conferences and to help work the land on the Nassar Farm, which is under constant threat. The family has been in a 35-year legal process to keep their land amid growing Israeli settlements surrounding the property.

Trinity members have visited the land and Daoud has visited Trinity many times. He and his wife Jihan decided to become affiliate members as they consider Trinity their church in the United States. This presentation will be like the zoom call held during the Trinity Fall Retreat. We hope you will join us.




### **Wednesday Bible Chat**


### **Mental Health Blog: The "Great Flex"**
